CONSENT JUDGMENT OF JUDGE M S KING

[1] Mr Beecharaju has challenged a determination of the Employment Relations Authority to the extent it related to him and to his liability for payments awarded by the Authority.¹

[2] The parties have resolved all matters between them in relation to this proceedings and the determination, and they have reached a full and final settlement of all matters between them (including those arising out of the employment relationship between them).

- (b) This proceeding is discontinued.
- (c) The terms of the settlement, which are set out in a settlement agreement, are confidential to the parties and their advisers.

[5] I commend the parties for reaching agreement, which will enable them to move forward.
